Speaker: RADM John T. Babb, R.Ph., M.P.A.

Rear Admiral John Babb received his pharmacy degree from the University of Tennessee and his Masters of Public Administration from the University of Memphis. In former assignments, he was the director of the national pharmacy program and Chief of Health Programs for the Federal Bureau of Prisons. From 2000 through 2006, Babb was the Director of the Office of Force Readiness and Deployment in the Office of the Surgeon General. He was responsible for coordinating the readiness and response capabilities of the U.S. Public Health Service. The Medical Reserve Corps was also in his immediate office. In 2002, he was promoted to Assistant Surgeon General.

Today, Babb serves as the Regional Health Administrator in Region VII, carrying out initiatives to protect, promote and advance the health of the citizens of Missouri, Kansas, Iowa, and Nebraska by addressing women's health, HIV/AIDS, minority health, family planning, reproductive health, medical readiness, and other public health issues — particularly for those populations suffering health disparities.

Speaker: David A. Wohl, M.D.



David A. Wohl, M.D. is Clinical Associate Professor Medicine, Division of Infectious Diseases at the University of North Carolina - Chapel Hill, School of Medicine. He is also Co-Principal Investigator for the University of North Carolina AIDS Clinical Trials Unit and Service Chief for the Division of Infectious Diseases. Since 1997, Dr. Wohl has served as Co-Director of HIV Services for the North Carolina Department of Corrections. Wohl received undergraduate degrees in biology, biological sciences and biomedical education. He received

his medical degree in 1991 from Robert Wood Johnson Medical School in Camden, New Jersey. He completed his residency in internal medicine at Duke University Medical Center and a fellowship in infectious diseases at the University of North Carolina - Chapel Hill.

Dr. Wohl has received several awards including multiple Center for AIDS Research Awards and the University of North Carolina Department of Medicine Faculty Teaching Award. He has contributed to numerous publications and serves as a reviewer for several journals. Dr. Wohl has been an invited presenter on HIV issues at national conferences and currently serves as investigator on a number of research projects for the National Institutes of Health.

Speaker: Donald M. Jensen, M.D., FACP



Donald M. Jensen, M.D., FACP is Professor of Medicine at the University of Chicago. He is also the Director of the Center for Liver Diseases at the University of Chicago Hospitals. Jensen received his undergraduate degree from the University of Illinois - Urbana and his medical degree from the University of Illinois College of Medicine. He completed his medical internship at Presbyterian-St. Luke's Hospital and pursued his residency and gastroenterology fellowship at Rush-Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center in Chicago. Dr. Jensen completed an additional fellowship in hepatology research at the Liver Unit, King's College Hospital in London. He was

Director of the Section of Hepatology at Rush University Medical Center until 2005. In 2005, he became Director of the Center for Liver Diseases at the University of Chicago.

Jensen has received several awards for his teaching and most recently received the Best Doctors in America Award and the Chicago's Top Physicians award from *Chicago Magazine*. He is currently President of the Illinois chapter of the American Liver Foundation and also a member of its national board of directors. Dr. Jensen also holds consultative positions including the Roche Global Hepatitis Advisory Board, Boehringer-Ingelheim Hepatitis Medical Advisory Board, and Globelmmune, Inc. Advisory Board. He is currently an editor for *Current Hepatitis Reports*, and is a contributor to more than 200 publications, abstracts, and books. Dr. Jensen has been an invited lecturer of numerous presentations covering topics in viral hepatitis, cirrhosis, and liver transplantation.
