The tours are provided as educational tools by the Louisiana Department of Public Safety and Corrections. Transportation to and from the facilities is provided — some are providing lunch. Tours are available to registered conference attendees at no charge. ACA Congress badge must be worn to have access. Photo identification is required to enter each facility. Cell phones, pocket knives, guns or other weapons are not allowed inside any facility. Sign-up sheets are provided in the ACA Registration area.

The IMPACT program was established in 1987. It is one of several Boot Camp operations in the US today. It has received both national and international attention having been featured as a model program by ACA and recipient of the "Best Practices Award".
