## Central Florida Reception Center (FLDOC)

## Orlando, Florida – 27.61 miles/36 minutes

Central Florida Reception Center, CFRC, opened in August 1988 and was originally designed as a permanent facility to house close custody adult male inmates. Before it was fully functional, the mission changed to a reception center. The facility was the state of Florida's second of four prototypical institutions. Today, CFRC houses male inmates and is designated to accept community, minimum, medium and close custody inmates.

## Orlando, Florida – 19.14 miles/27 minutes

The Orlando Work Release Center is an 84 bed work release center housing community custody female inmates. The facility was constructed in 1972 and opened as Orlando Community Correctional Center housing 56 male inmates. The work release program works in association with society to prepare inmates for return to the community as productive, law-abiding citizens through gradual reintegration of inmates back into the community by means of participation in employment, and other rehabilitative programs.

## Orlando, Florida – 9.21 miles/13 minutes

The Kissimmee Work Release Center is located at 2925 Michigan Ave in Kissimmee Florida. This center is a member of the Florida Department of Corrections, Central Florida Reception Center Family. The center rests on 3 ½ acres and consists of ten buildings. It currently houses 117 inmates and upon completion of ongoing construction will house an additional 156 inmates; making it the second largest work release center in the state of Florida. The Kissimmee Work Release Center is committed to professionalism

by offering their inmates the opportunity to grow through religious, substance abuse, GED, Wellness education and anger management programs. Our goal is for our inmates to be able to excel during their stay here and after their release back into society.

## Tallahassee, Florida – 26.53 miles/29 minutes

Demilly Correctional Institution is the department's newest institution. The mission of Demilly Correctional Institution is designed to assist inmates to re-enter the community. The program will offer each inmate assigned to the facility the opportunity to be assessed and receive integrated transitional re-entry services while completing their term of incarceration. The goal of the program is to decrease the probability of recidivism. The common program element is community re-entry and the actual re-entry community will serve as the agent of change.

## Polk Correctional Institution (FLDOC)

## Polk City, Florida – 25.95 miles/28 minutes

Polk Correctional Institution is a major correctional institution that sits on 49 acres located in Polk City, Florida. The Main Unit, originally designed for six hundred (600) inmates, began construction in 1976. The first inmates arrived on May 1, 1978. The Work Camp, adjacent to the north end of the main unit compound, was completed in November of 1985 with a capacity of two hundred ninety-two (292). Polk Correctional Institution offers Educational, Vocational, Literacy, Religious, Wellness, AA & NA, and PRIDE industry programs. In Mid-October of 2010 Polk CI's mission change from housing minimum, medium and close custody inmates to housing inmates who meet the criteria of the Re-Entry efforts of the Florida Department of Corrections. By becoming the second Re-Entry facility in this region Polk CI added an extensive Modality program which reinforces the efforts in reducing recidivism while maintaining public safety.

## [Orange Youth Academy \(OYA\) \(FLDOJJ\)](#)

The Orange Youth Academy is a high-risk residential 48-bed male program with an anticipated length of stay of 9-12 months. The program provides Mental Health Overlay Services (MHOS). Treatment and educational programs are based on the therapeutic community model, incorporate the principles of restorative justice and reflect proven cognitive-behavioral treatment modalities. The goal is to provide an environment that offers opportunity for growth and fosters feelings of safety and wellbeing.

## [Orange County Booking and Release Center \(BRC\) \(Orange County Corrections\)](#)

The BRC is a 592-bed, four-story, 300-thousand square foot facility. The BRC houses multiple agencies including Corrections, the Circuit Court, State Attorney, Public Defender, Clerk of the Court, and Sheriff's Office Court Deputies. It has three courtrooms, medical and mental health housing areas, pre-trial services, and inmate records management.

The Orange Regional Juvenile Detention Center is a 151-bed, hardware secure facility that serves youth detained by various circuit courts. Youth are detained pending adjudication, disposition or placement in a commitment facility. Services for youth include education, mental health, substance abuse, and health care. Medical, mental health and food services are contracted services. Educational services are funded by the Department of Education through local school districts.

## [Orange County Corrections - Female Detention Center \(FDC\) \(Orange County Corrections\)](#)

All female inmates, including female juveniles who are being tried as adults, are held in this facility. FDC became operational in March 2003. It is a 652-bed facility consists of both max-level lock-down cells and direct-supervision dormitories.

## [The Transition House, Inc. \(Kissimmee Transition Work Release Center\)](#)

Kissimmee, Florida – 10 miles/15 minutes

The Transition House, Inc. is a 155-bed, contracted Substance Abuse/Work Release facility. Our facility houses only male offenders and is located at 900 East Vine Street, Kissimmee, FL. We were refurbished and finished in 2005 and originally housed inmates and homeless veterans. Our veterans now are housed in another facility in St. Cloud, FL. Our inmates are sent here by the DC for an intensive 9-month treatment program that includes classes such as Criminal Thinking, Family Development, Understanding Addiction, Budgeting, Anger/Stress Management, etc. These mandatory classes are complemented with a Vocational program for computers, and a mandatory GED program for those in need. Once they've completed the Transition side of our program they remain here for up to 14 months in a Work Release status. This gives our inmates – here for a substance abuse background – the opportunity to earn money for their re-entry upon their EOS.

### **Coleman, Florida – 49 miles/45 minutes**

The Federal Correctional Complex located in Coleman, Florida, is the largest Federal Complex in the nation, comprising five separate components, which includes an Administrative (Shared Services) facility, a male Low level security facility, a male Medium level facility with a female satellite Camp, and two male High level security facilities (United States Penitentiaries) with a total inmate population of over 7,250 inmates. The Complex is located in Central Florida, approximately fifty miles northwest of Orlando, sixty miles northeast of Tampa, and thirty-five miles south of Ocala. The Complex property consists of 1,700 acres, situated south of the town of Coleman, off Highway 301 on State Road 470 in Sumter County. The total staff complement is approximately 1335 employees, making the Complex the largest employer in Sumter County.

## Osceola County Jail - (Osceola County Corrections Dept.)

### **Kissimmee, Florida – 14.76 miles/20 minutes**

The Osceola County Jail is located at 402 Simpson Road in Kissimmee, Florida. The facility was built in 1986 with a total bed capacity of 330; operated by the Sheriff until the Board of County Commissioners assumed responsibility in 1997 changed the name to Osceola County Corrections Department (OCCD). Expansions and renovations in 1998 increased the total bed capacity to 873, which does not include medical and segregation cells. The average inmate daily population for the 2010 Calendar Year was 1019. Expansions also included two direct supervision units, a kitchen, a new booking/intake/release area, a multi-purpose area, classrooms, and a laundry. OCCD is responsible for the daily operations of Judicial Services, Security/Operations Division, Public Safety Security, Pre-Trial Release/Community Corrections Division, Health Services Division and Forensic Drug Testing Lab Division. Currently, there are 434 authorized positions, 383 are filled. During the 2009-2010 Fiscal Year, Pre-Trial Release supervised 2,765 cases with 81% completion rate; 2,035 cases successfully closed during this period. On September 11, 2010, Sherry Johnson was appointed as the Chief of Corrections for Osceola County.
