Highlights will include a self-guided 30-40 minute tour of the Ryman Auditorium, which began as a church and then later became the music hall for country legends such as Roy Acuff, Dolly Parton and Hank Williams. This National Historic Landmark is formerly the home of the Grand Ole Opry (1943-1974) and currently continues its 100-plus years of music tradition by offering the best in today's country entertainment.

You will also have the opportunity to spend more than an hour enjoying a self-guided tour of the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum. Since 1967, this monumental edifice has been the home of America's country music heritage. Inside, the Museum contains a vast collection of memorabilia that reveals country music's magnificent history.

The tour will conclude at an authentic Nashville Honky Tonk featuring live Country Music. *Don't miss this chance to discover the wonders of Nashville.*
