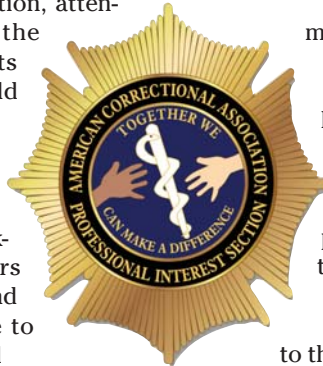


Correctional Health Perspectives

The American Correctional Association's 137th Congress of Correction in Kansas City, Mo., Aug. 10-15, will have more 100 workshops examining all areas of correctional administration, programs and services.
